The Christian teaching on the Most Holy Trinity is based on what has been revealed of God in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus of Nazareth. It is Christianity's answer to the question: who is God? The Jewish people knew God only as one. With the proclamation of Jesus as divine this question took on a fresh urgency. Feast of St Colmcille-St. Colmcille, Abbot and Missionary –Friday 9th June,

c. 521-597, one of the 'Twelve Apostles of Ireland', was born in Gartan, Co. Donegal. He founded monasteries at Derry, Durrow and Kells but felt compelled to leave Ireland as an act of penance around 563. With twelve companions he settles at Iona, just off the Isle of Mull, and this became the effective base for the evangelisation of Scotland and northern England. He died in 597 and his relics were later translated to Dunkeld
