OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

On the last Sunday of the Liturgical Year, today, we celebrate the feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Universal King. It was instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925 at the close of the Jubilee Year. Jesus was questioned at his trial: are you a king? His answer serves to highlight how different his kingship is from that of human rulers.



Reflection - For Luke what was written over the cross of Jesus was a statement of fact. This is the King of the Jews. An indication of the values which underlie his kingdom is got from the events surrounding the scene. Jesus bears with mockery and abuse, accepts the questioning of the Jewish leaders, the soldiers and a criminal beside him and dies forgiving his enemies. *(Source: St. Paul's Missal)*

Visit of the relic of Blessed Carlo Acutis

This week, the relic of Blessed Carlo Acutis is visiting the Archdiocese of Dublin. The relic has travelled to Ireland from Assisi's Sanctuary of the Renunciation, the Church where Blessed Carlo's remains are housed and displayed. It is a first-class relic, meaning it is a piece of Blessed Carlo's body.

It will come to the Church of the Holy Redeemer, Bray, Co. Wicklow, this Saturday, November 25, and Sunday, November 26; to the Church of the Holy Family, Aughrim Street, Dublin 7, this Sunday, November 26; and to St Kevin's Church, Kilnamanagh, Dublin 24, and St Kilian's Church, Kingswood, Dublin 24, on Monday, November 27. Blessed Carlo Acutis was born in London to Italian parents, but grew up in Milan, Italy, where his family relocated when he was just a child. From a young age, he displayed an extraordinary devotion to his Catholic faith. He attended Mass daily, regularly receiving the sacraments. He was known for centering his life on the Eucharist. "Always to be united with Jesus," he would say, "this is my programme of life." Carlo set up a website documenting Eucharistic miracles, and is now considered a patron saint of the internet. On October 10, 2020, he was beatified by Pope Francis, becoming the first millennial to be declared 'Blessed' by the Catholic Church. It was said at the time that his beatification highlighted "the significance of his witness, particularly for the younger generation, demonstrating that holiness is attainable even in our modern world".
